#### II. Legislative Affairs:

- Dan Moy and John Down met with Delegate Rob Bell on January 5, 2023 to advocate for the six Joint Leadership Council (JLC) initiatives ahead of the 2023 Legislative Session. Bell represents the 58th District in Virginia, serving the majority of our Central Virginia Chapter (CVC) members. We used the JLC's prioritization to provide a "map" for our discussion. We also highlighted three key initiatives that had Governor Youngkin's advance support. Bell expressed his willingness to vote for each of these initiatives as bills, although his commitment to other initiatives prohibited him from serving as a patron or co-patron.
- 2. On March 7, in the wake of the Session, the Legislative Committee (LegCom) responded to a question from Delegate Bell concerning the list of veteran-related measures that passed this year that we were tracking. We are thankful to Delegate Bell for his support and long tenure of service in the House of Delegates (He announced his retirement from the General Assembly in February).
