**VI. Most Significant Chapter Events of the Quarter:**

a. Forty-eight members, spouses and guests attended the April 7 spring social. Osbourn Park High School's NJROTC honor guard posted the colors for the Pledge of Allegiance. Josh Goldberg, executive director of Boulder Crest Foundation gave a presentation on the science of post-traumatic growth for trauma survivors. They also were docents at a June 14 event for three busloads of veterans of those wars from St. Petersburg, Fla., including 30 female veterans.

c. A National MOAA Medal was provided to the Liberty High School JROTC unit for their top rising senior; the school did not have an award ceremony.

d. In early May National MOAA Development Department notified the chapter that it was awarded a \$1,500 grant to support the Willing Warrior Retreat Center in Haymarket, Va. The grant will help pay the cost of a recovering veteran and family to enjoy a stay at the retreat to bond and reconnect.
