II. Legislative Affairs: COL Victoria Revilla (President); CW4 Bruce Brown (Legislative Chair) had an office call with 15th Virginia District, State Senator Joe Morrissey on 20 Jan 2020. Senator Morrissey stated he would also be willing to assist VCOC with obtaining a meeting place next year for the “Storming” of the Virginia Assembly.

III. Public Affairs: COL Revilla attended the unveiling ceremony and reception of the historical marker for the First Baptist Church in Petersburg, VA. The church celebrated its 250 years anniversary; one of the oldest black churches in the U.S.A.

V. Most Significant Chapter Event of the Quarter:

a. Major General Eugene Stillions, US Army (Retired) one of the longest chapter members with 40+ years, passed away in February. At the time he joined the chapter he was the Army Quartermaster General and the Commander of Fort Lee. MG Stillions has lived in Springfield, Virginia for the last 25 years but chose to maintain his membership, often paying a visit to chapter members when he attended events at the Fort Lee base. An athletic field on Fort Lee will be named in his honor; the dedication ceremony has been re-scheduled for September 2020.

b. The chapter’s annual meeting scheduled for the end of March was cancelled.

c. Chapter Scholarship submission deadline was extended to 30 March due to the COVID-19 situation. The chapter has programmed \$15,000 to distribute next quarter to scholarship and grant recipients and will be providing a \$200 check to all 9 school ROTC programs supported within the chapter’s area of responsibility.
